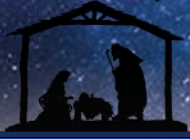

It is often said that it's the little things in life that make a difference and our Sisters of St. Joseph residents know that they can depend on the Crann sisters

for anything needed to bring them comfort in their Bethany home. Benefactors make it possible for Bethany to provide all of its women religious and lay residents the highest quality of healthcare, as well as a comfortable, home-like environment in which to live their lives to the fullest. In addition to caring for the spiritual life of the total person, residents are afforded a full range of physical, intellectual, creative, interactive and social programs through our Activities Department.

Our Bethany family of residents, who range in age from 67 to 105 years old, depends on the continued generosity of its donors through our Annual Fund.
