Her Life's Ambition of Service...Fulfilled

Have you ever wished to take a single childhood memory, blow it up into a bubble, and live inside it forever?

When she was young, Sister Therezon Sheerin, CSJ, and her sister would play Mass with a card table as the altar. Sister Therezon played the priest.

But she knew, even then, that she wanted to be a nun. The Sisters of St. Joseph of Boston was the order she chose.

When she entered the convent, World War II was ending.

Sr. Therezon says, "In those days, the novitiate was in Framingham. There were 63 women who entered with me. I never once considered that I might be sent home."

When you ask her about her education, you'll learn that Sister Therezon has a Bachelor of Arts in Chemistry from Regis College and a Master of Arts in Psychology from Catholic University. She taught Psychology at Regis for thirty-five years before going on to work in the Sisters of St. Joseph archives. Reminiscing today, she remembers how she loved interacting with the students, the women of Regis.

Now, as a resident of Bethany Health Care Center, Sister Therezon is the picture of contentment. The food, the feasts, the services, and the activities combine to make for rewarding days.

"They can't do enough for you here. The new Welcome Center is a great place to visit to get out of your room. Each holiday and holy day is special. Whatever the donors give is put to the service of the residents."

Foundation Funding...Making a World of Difference

The healthcare system in Massachusetts is struggling with the gap between the cost of care and reimbursements, leaving long-term care facilities to make up the difference.

Thanks to two generous grants, the women of Bethany continue to enjoy the highest quality care.

With the support of the **Agnes Lindsay Trust**, Bethany purchased **four laptops to improve care and keep records efficiently**.

A grant from the **Catholic Health Foundation of Greater Boston** helped buy **essential medical equipment, including a device for wound**

treatment and a lift that promotes resident independence.

According to Maureen Dulko, RN, Director of Nursing, "This equipment **provides cost savings, streamlines procedures, and optimizes nursing resources**. These purchases will have an immediate impact on our delivery of exceptional care."
